### **Meeting Overview**

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On Monday, November 7, 2022, the project team hosted the first public meeting for the Mauckport Comprehensive Plan. Three community members attended the meeting to discuss existing opportunities and challenges for the town. While the project team provided five interactive stations to gather input, the majority of the meeting was centered around a general discussion between the five attendees. The input that was gathered is summarized below.

#### General comments

- Attendees like that the town is quiet and peaceful but still want to see some progress for the community.
- All of the residents mind their own business.
- Town recently received two community crossing grants.
- The park shelter is well-used and rented for \$100.
- Town received \$19,000 in COVID relief funds. (Will likely be used to fix the Erosion problem now)

#### Challenges

- Broadband
- Drainage on the north side of 2<sup>nd</sup> street and the northwest corner of walnut street and 4<sup>th</sup> street.
- Flooding from the river
- County has pretty strict regulations for septic tanks in the floodplain making it hard for residents.
- Money – The town's only source of income is money from the Riverboat. Prior to COVID it was usually \$3,000 per month. Now it's only 3,000 every 3 months.

- ADA compliance – Town recently completed an ADA study that identifies where priority improvements are needed.
- The town has very little/no police presence so there is a feeling of isolation.
- People don't show up – there is a major lack of interest.
- Erosion problem down at the river - \$30,000 to fix.

### Desired Improvements

- Preservation of the historic bell in the park shelter.
- New tables are needed at the park.
- Concrete needs to be fixed at the shelter and cameras could help with vandalism.
- The Corydon Community Services wanted to host a food truck / mobile pantry in the church parking lot – this is needed for the community.
- There could be a desire to annex land to the west of the current town limits.
